National meeting PROCEFFA 2020



On 15 March 2021, the 2020 edition of the PROCEFFA's National Meeting was held at the National Episcopal Conference of Cameroon in Mvolyé, under the theme " Abetter addressing of the thematic sectorial challenges for the sustainability of the CEFFAs Movement in Cameroon". These challenges fed the reflections in the different thematic groups and the results were consolidated during the work of the National meeting. In addition to PROCEFFA, member organisations, representatives of sectorial ministries, PROCEFFA's partner organisations, government programmes, etc. took part in the meeting. The National Meetings organised each year by the PROCEFFA are the culmination of the regional meetings and contribute to the achievement of one of the platform's objectives, namely that of " Pooling member's experiences and synergising their skills to better meet the training needs offered by the CEFFAs".

- A word from the Executive Secretary: In his speech, Mr. KATIHABWA Pie presented the context of the meeting, highlighting the challenges faced by the IFER, EFA and CFP in the vocational training of rural and peri-urban youth, and therefore the strategies that will be developed to face these challenges.
A word from the VIA Don Bosco Delegate Programme Manager in Cameroon Bosco in Cameroon: Mr. Filip MAENHOUT articulated his intervention on "the process of perpetuation of the CEFFA movement in Cameroon" through elements such as the quality of the products from the CEFFAs : (1); socio-professional integration (2); the anchoring of the CEFFAs in their territory

After the family photo and the interview with the media, the presentation phase began. These were in turn:

- Presentation n°1 on the National Development Strategy (NDS 30) presented by Mr. Moïse WALAH;
- Presentation n°2 on the IFER/agricultural colleagues facing the challenge of official recognition, presented by Hervé Berlin MOUDIO ;
- Presentation n°3 on the training offer CEFFA and its adequacy with the Cameroonian context, presented by BIRWE Benoît ;
- Presentation No. 4 on VETCs facing the challenge of adaptation of the training offer to the needs of the territory, presented by BARKA Honoré.



- The opening speech of the PCA of PROCEFFA: In her speech, Mrs. Mariam HAMAMA ADAMA dwelt on some of the challenges (the challenge of the recognition of the IFERs, the matching the training to the training with the context of the work-linked training policy implemented in the implemented in the CEFFAs, the implementation of a of training in a context of health crisis (COVID-19) and security crisis in the North-West, South-West and Far-North), appreciated the ingenuity and bravery of the FOs, who, despite these challenges, have continued to provide quality comprehensive quality training to learners. She closed her speech by thanking the Belgian Development Cooperation, VIA Don Bosco and the TFPs for their multifaceted support to the promotion of CEFFAs in Cameroon.

In her closing remarks, Ms Mariam HAMAN ADAMA expressed her satisfaction with the quality of the exchanges that marked this edition of the national meeting. She also thanked the present sectorial for their rich contributions to the work. She concluded by wishing participants a safe journey home.



Throughout the day, the work carried out through a participatory approach was punctuated by presentations, group works and exchanges in plenary sessions. The general objective of this meeting was to discuss the challenges and issues related to the work-linked vocational training of young people in the CEFFA...More specifically, it was a question of defining strategies in order to deal with those challenges and issues faced by the youth in those centres.

The meeting chaired by M. Jean NKAMA started with the official opening, was articulated in four axes:

PROCEFFA toward the Programme VIA Don Bosco Cameroon 2022-2026

From Monday 12 to Friday 16 November 2021, was held in Yaoundé at the SAFARI Hotel, the 2nd formulation workshop of the New PRG VIA Don Bosco Cameroon 2022-2026 in which 56 participants (cf. list of participants, list in annex) from the two (02) beneficiary entities (PROCEFFA and SDB/FMA). Organised by VIA Don Bosco and facilitated through a participatory approach by Mr. Filip MAENHOUT, Manager of PRG



Delegate VIA Don Bosco Cameroon, this workshop, which followed the first one, focused the definition of indicators, the sustainability strategy, risk analysis and budgeting.

The goal was to:

- Finalize the logical framework of the new Cameroon 2022-2026 VIA Don Bosco PGR
- Define the strategy the strategy and propose a sustainable action plan in line with the priorities defined during the first formulation workshop held in November 2020
- Provide the elements for the contextual analysis for the coming programme
- Conduct a risks analysis (identifying the conditions necessary and calculate the likelihood of these conditions are met
- Assess the impact of these conditions on the program)

The workshop started on April 12, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. with the welcoming speech of Mr. Filip MAENHOUT, followed by the prayer said by Father SABE and the introduction of the SDB/FMA team.

The Executive Director of PROCEFFA , M. KATIHABWA Pie, took the floor in his turn to briefly introduce the PROCEFFA team, the various promoter organisations and the staff of the Executive Direction , before apologizing on the behalf of the Board of Directors president.

As introduction, Mr. Filip MAENHOUT presented the objectives and the agenda of the workshop, the practical arrangements,



without forgetting to remind to the participant of the strict observance of barrier measures against COVID -19 (mandatory wearing of masks, hands washing with soap and running water, frequent use of hydro alcoholic gel).



Welfare Caristas Kumbo were still on their way. Mr. Filip recalled his role as facilitator of the workshop with Ms. Stephanie DE RYCK who is Senior Assistant to Ms. Kaat TORFS the Coordinator of International Cooperation. He will also virtually involve Stéphanie DE RYCK who could not made the trip because of the actual health crisis. The facilitator briefly spoke about the Belgium situation concerning the pandemic.

The main articulations of the workshop program were presented as follows:

- Day 1:results and model activities
- Day 2:Sustainability
- Day 3: indicators and sources of verification
- Day 4: Risks
- Day 5:Budget

To close the workshop, Father SABE, Mr. Célestine WANYUY and Mr. Filip MAENHOUT, took the floor to thank, acknowledge the presence and active participation of the organizations during the workshop for the formulation of the 2022-2026 PRG.

Educational mobility partners visit (SAAM) at the Baré's Youth Vocational Training Center

SAAM (Supporting Alliance for Africa Mobility) is a pilot project for educational mobility between Africa and Europe in the field of vocational training. This agreement between SAAM and PROCEFFA was signed in July 2020.

SAAM operates in 24 countries, 8 of which are countries in the European Union and Sixteen (16) countries in Africa; thirty-two (32) partners with three areas concerned, namely agriculture hotel and tourism, engineering and manufacturing. To the tune of €4,000,000 funded by the AU-EU Youth Skills Employment Programme.

It is for the period from 13 to 25 March 2020 that two members of the members of the SAAM team (Hugo Fernandez and Sergio Lagarde), were in Cameroon to visit two partners of partners (the Don Bosco Technical Institute of Ebolowa and the CFPJ of Baré.



It was a convivial atmosphere between the visit to the CFPJ in Baré, as well as tourist, that the stay of the mobility partners ended in Cameroon.



After their visit to Ebolowa, Hugo and Sergio accompanied by BARKA and BATANA, went to Baré with a stopover at the stop over at the Executive Direction of PROCEFFA to meet the staff of the latter.

The aim was to:

- Assess the ownership of the different phases of the project by the participants' ownership of the different phases of the project;



- Present the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme;
- Visit the vocational training centre "Don Bosco Boys Town Technical Instit", SAAM's partner in Nairobi ;
- Establish joint focus groups on European peer mobility in mobility of European peers in African training centres;
- Establish peer focus groups on mobility of African teachers to Europe;
- Establish peer reflection groups on mobility of students/learners from African training centres to Europe;

Establish joint reflection groups on communication/visibility of project activities.
